


General Information About the Continents

From the 16th century the English noun continent was derived from the term continent land, meaning continuous or connected land and translated from the Latin terra *continens*. The noun was used to mean "a connected or continuous tract of land" or mainland.

Our world is made up of seven continents. A continent is one of several large landmasses. Generally identified by convention rather than any strict criteria, up to seven regions are commonly regarded as continents. Ordered from largest in area to smallest, these seven regions are: Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Antarctica, Europe, and Australia.

When geographers identify a continent, they usually include all the islands associated with it. An interesting fact is sometimes Europe and Asia are considered one continent called Eurasia.


