



Food Chains

Term	Definition
Ecosystem	all the living and nonliving things in an area
Predator	an animal that eats another animal
Prey	an animal that is eaten by another animal
Consumer	a living thing that cannot make its own food
Producer	a living thing that can produce its own food
Primary consumer	an animal that eats only plants (herbivore)
Secondary consumer	an animal that eats only other animals (carnivore)
Tertiary consumer	an animal that eats both primary and secondary consumers
Decomposer	creature that gets its energy from eating dead animals or plants

frogs




Amazon River

Consumers: capybara, caiman




American Desert

Consumers: beetle, lizard, roadrunner




American Grassland

Consumers: insects, bandicoot, rufous owl




Boreal Forest/Taiga

horned owl, lynx




Coniferous Forest
